2. Publication of Draft Joint Dementia Strategy 2016 - 2021

An estimated 1,947 people over 65 years of age are living with dementia in Richmond, and this is expected to increase by 15% increase over the next 5 years. Richmond Council and Richmond Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) are working with a range of local stakeholders to develop the Draft of the Joint Dementia Strategy 2016-2021, bringing information about the range of provision for people with dementia and their carers in Richmond into one place. It looks at all aspects of dementia care and services, from prevention to end of life and explores where more could be done. The Council and CCG are keen to hear your views on the draft. 4. New fund for community engagement events from Healthwatch

Healthwatch are offering funding to local organisations and groups to run fun and engaging one-off activities or events to engage local people in the NHS. You could bid for a maximum of £750 per event, and applications for smaller grants are strongly encouraged to reach as many people as possible. If you have an idea for activities or events that would be enjoyable to local people and provide an opportunity for them to engage with the local NHS then apply now. Examples of activities could include tea dances; pottery classes; fun days; drop in sessions; pizza and movie afternoons, cultural activities etc. People from the local NHS will attend these events/activities to talk to local people about their experience of services and collect information and views.
